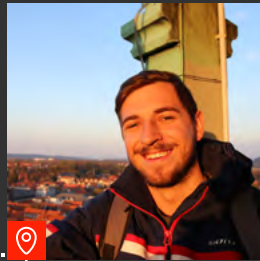

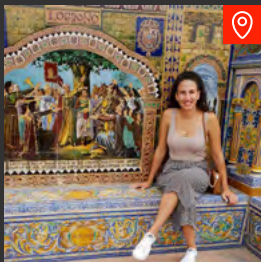

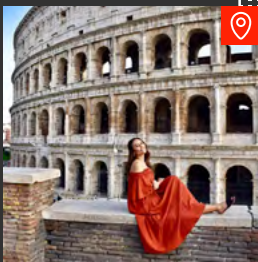

**There's no better way to prepare for the global workforce than to experience the world while you study. Combine one of 28 UTS courses with a Bachelor of International Studies and spend up to a year overseas.**

Before you leave for the adventure of a lifetime, we'll make sure you're prepared with the intercultural skills and knowledge needed for your destination.

Our combined International Studies degrees enable you to learn a language (Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese or Spanish), deepen your understanding of the history and culture of your language choice, develop intercultural communication skills, and provide you the opportunity to study abroad and/or undertake an internship at an international organisation.

## COURSE STRUCTURE

Students choose one of three options:

- 1. Language, Culture & the Professional World:** includes an internship and option of a short study abroad experience (2-6 weeks) overseas.
- 2. Language, Culture & Global Exchange:** includes an internship and a 6-month global exchange at any UTS partner university.
- 3. International Honours:** includes a full year at a relevant overseas partner university where you will complete an honours level research project. You will undertake this 'embedded' International Honours in your fourth or final year of your degree, and graduate at the same time as your peers who are enrolled in the first two options.\*

Students enrolled in the International Honours stream will be eligible for a generous reimbursement towards their international travel expenses and may be eligible for an OS-HELP loan. Those who travel on Global Exchange or a short study experience may apply for a competitive stipend and/or may be eligible for an OS-HELP loan.

## WHY INTERNATIONAL STUDIES AT UTS?

- UTS was the first university in Australia to offer International Studies as part of a combined degree, now running for nearly 30 years!
- Develop skills and attributes such as resilience, adaptability, independence, time and project management and critical thinking. These are in-demand skills that will help you stand out in your first interview
- Give your professional degree an international edge and gain the communication and intercultural skills required for a career overseas or in a multinational organisation
- Spend time studying at one of our 200+ partner universities around the world, or undertake a whole year of international study with the Honours program
- Build a network of global connections that you can draw upon throughout your personal and professional life

This course is flexible with different overseas study options.

\*Students will submit an expression of interest for the honours year after Autumn results release in year 2. Students who maintain a credit point average weighted average mark (WAM) for their combined degree can opt into the honours and go on In-Country Study (ICS) in their fourth year. This study must be undertaken in a ICS partner university where the language of instruction is the language of the major.

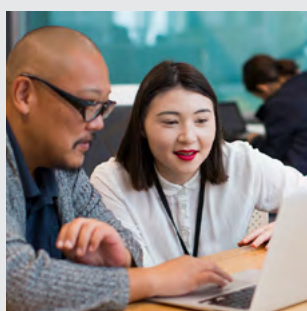
The Diploma in Languages can be taken concurrently with undergraduate or postgraduate coursework degree program at UTS or another Australian university or as further learning.

## STUDY PATTERN

This diploma may be taken concurrently with your UTS degree or as additional learning. You'll study one Diploma in Languages subject per session. For most UTS students, this will mean that enrolling in the Diploma will increase your load from 24cp per session (the standard full-time load for undergraduates) to 32cp per session. Overseas short-term study opportunities may also be available in July or Summer sessions.

## LANGUAGE AND CULTURE SUBJECTS

You'll study language and culture subjects, completing one subject a session over a total of six sessions. You'll build capabilities in listening, speaking, reading and writing – and you'll also explore the popular culture, cultural practices and current affairs related to your chosen region. When it comes to class allocation, you'll be grouped according to your level of proficiency. No previous experiences in your chosen language? No problem – we've got classes to suit all levels.

## WHY A DIPLOMA IN LANGUAGES AT UTS?

- Develop writing, speaking, listening and reading skills in at least one language other than English.
- Give your professional degree an international edge
- Get prepared to succeed in a range of international environments and to embrace globalised work opportunities
- Don't add time to your degree – study a Diploma alongside your professional degree

## ADMISSION AND APPLICATION

- For students without a bachelor's degree, the Diploma must be taken concurrently with another coursework program – it is not a standalone degree.
- Students who have completed a bachelor's degree at UTS or another university can undertake the Diploma as a standalone degree (one subject per session).
- Students with no prior language knowledge must commence in the Autumn session.

# For applicants based outside of Australia looking to study this course

## **ELIGIBILITY**

International applicants require a competitive pass in a recognised matriculation examination, equivalent to an Australian Year 12 qualification or a recognised bachelor's degree equivalent to an Australian bachelor's degree.

## **STUDENT VISAS**

To be eligible to apply for a student visa to study in Australia, international students must enrol in a course offered full time and on campus. Australian student visa regulations also require international students studying on student visas to complete the course within the standard full-time duration. Students can extend their courses only in exceptional circumstances.

## **ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS**

There is an English-language proficiency requirement to undertake this course. For international students or local applicants with international qualifications, these are determined by the relevant professional degree.
