

UTS Prize Conditions of Award SESL Australia Prize

Faculty: Design, Architecture Building (DAB)

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below prize ('Prize') and the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS regarding this Prize. The administrative processes to support awarding this Prize will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

1. PRIZE NAME: SESL Australia Prize

2. PURPOSE

The SESL Australia Prize is to reward academic excellence in an integrated studio focused on a Landscape Architecture project.

3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

3.1 Number of Recipients:

- Up to three (3) Recipients will be awarded the prize in each calendar year.
- The Prize may be awarded to an individual or to a student group.

3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

The award will be in the form of:

- A cash prize of up to \$1500.
- Where the prize is awarded to a student team, the total cash prize will be distributed equally amongst the team members.

3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The Recipient/s will receive one payment by electronic funds transfer to his/her nominated bank account.
- Where the Prize is awarded to a student team, the Prize amount will be divided equally amongst the team members, and each team member will receive their payment by electronic funds transfer to their nominated bank account.

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Prize, a candidate must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be enrolled in the:
 - 1. Bachelor of Landscape Architecture (Honours) (C09079v3)
 - 2. Masters in Architecture (C04235v2)
 - 3. Masters in Landscape Architecture (C04270v1) and;
- Be enrolled in one of the following subjects in the relevant academic year for which the award is made;
 - 1. Landscape Architecture Design Studio 7 (11191);
 - 2. Master of Landscape Architecture Design Studio 1 (11561);
 - 3. Master of Landscape Architecture Design Studio 3 (11563);
 - 4. Masters Architectural Design Studio 1 (11551);
 - 5. Masters Architectural Design Studio 2 (11552);
 - 6. Masters Architectural Design Studio 3 (11553);
 - 7. Masters Architectural Design Studio 4 (11554)

5. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA

- The Prize will be awarded to student/s demonstrating the most holistic merit, based on their final presentation assessment of the integrated studio (in the year for which the Prize is awarded). This will be determined by the Review Panel, and is based on demonstrating the following learning outcomes:
 - Ability to clearly communicate and strong presentation skills
 - o Response to the project brief within the disciplinary context
 - Quality of Work

6. SELECTION

The Recipient(s) of the Prize will be determined by the Review panel for the integrated studio final project. Determination of the Prize will be made using the above selection criteria. The recipients once endorsed by the Project Presentation Panel will be approved by the Dean of the Faculty of Design, Architecture and Building (or their nominee).

- The Recipient(s) determined by the panel will be identified by the School of Architecture, or Faculty of Design, Architecture and Building
- These Recipient(s) will be presented to the relevant course Director or Subject Coordinator/lecturer
 who will confirm the Recipient based on the selection criteria above as evidenced by their
 presentation and any document submission as presented to the panel.
- Project Presentation Panel:
 A presentation panel will be convened. The panel will include the Course Coordinator and Subject Coordinator/lecturer, and up to two (2) representatives from the Donor and include students from the same cohort.

7. OTHER CONDITIONS

None
