## What does this mean for me?

- Most of the current subjects in the Postgraduate Journalism courses will be phased out from 2017.
- **57011 Research and Reporting for Journalism** and **57185 Journalism Major Project 1** will run one more time in 2017 as there is no equivalent subject in the new course. Please enrol in these subjects in 2017 if you haven't already completed them.
- Subjects which will be set to Phase Out will be substituted with subjects from the new Advanced Journalism course.
- Your study plan will be amended and updated with these subject substitutes before enrolment begins for 2017.
- You will be able to choose a new elective from the Advanced Journalism elective choice bank.

## Can we transfer across to the new course?

- Yes. Students will need to submit an Internal Course Transfer (ICT) Application.
- If these ICT applications meet the academic requirements, they will be made an offer into the course.
- These ICT applicants **will not** need to submit a Personal Statement, CV or example of their professional work.
- Once admitted to the new course students will receive advanced standing for all the subjects previously undertaken.
- As the core subject 57011 Research and Reporting for Journalism in the current Journalism courses does not have an equivalent in the new courses it will be credited as an Elective.
- All students who ICT into either C04321 Master of Advanced Journalism or C06104 Graduate Diploma in Advanced Journalism will need to undertake **57083 Advanced Journalism**.
