

UTS Startups Summit 2024: Code of Conduct for Parents

Welcome to the UTS Startups Summit 2024! We are thrilled to have you and your children join us for a day of inspiration and learning about entrepreneurship and innovation.

We are committed to a safe, and educational experience for all attendees, we ask that all parents adhere to the following Code of Conduct as a condition for attending.

Responsibilities of Parents/Guardians

1. Supervision and Safety

- a. Parents/guardians are responsible for the supervision and safety of any students under their care during the event, whether their own children or other students.
- b. If you are supervising students who are not your own children, please ensure you have written consent from the respective parent/guardian.
- c. As a supervisor, you will be responsible for the behavior and conduct of any students under your supervision, including any damages caused.

2. Child Safety Recommendations

To ensure a safe and respectful environment for all students, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- a. Limit interactions with students to settings where their supervising teacher or guardian is present. Avoid any interactions with children without another adult present to ensure transparency.
- b. Do not put yourself in a 1-on-1 situation with a student in a private setting. If it becomes necessary to interact 1-on-1, ensure it takes place in a public or group setting where other adults are present.



c. Use designated bathrooms: There are separate adult/teacher-only and student-only bathrooms on site. Adults are required to use amenities labeled as Adult/Teacher Use Only to maintain safety and privacy for all attendees.

3. Behavior and Etiquette

- a. Look out for the wellbeing of all participants. If you observe any inappropriate behavior from students or other adults, please inform a UTS Startups event volunteer or teacher.
- b. Follow designated seating arrangements and adhere to instructions from event staff to help ensure a smooth experience for all.
- c. Model respectful behavior towards all attendees, speakers, and event staff, setting a positive example for students.

4. Emergency Procedures

- a. In an emergency, account for the location of the children under your supervision and ensure their safety.
- b. Follow all guidance from ICC Sydney staff and UTS Startups event volunteers/staff to ensure a coordinated and safe response.

If you do not adhere to this code of conduct, we may ask you and the children under your supervision to leave the event.
