The Cadetship Program provides opportunities for final year Indigenous undergraduate students and those who wish to progress into an Honours Program at UTS.

Cadets work up to 2 days per week on a professional paid contract and engage in:

- Mentoring undergraduate Indigenous students
- Tutoring for first and second year Indigenous undergraduate students
- Research activities within Jumbunna or a UTS Faculty

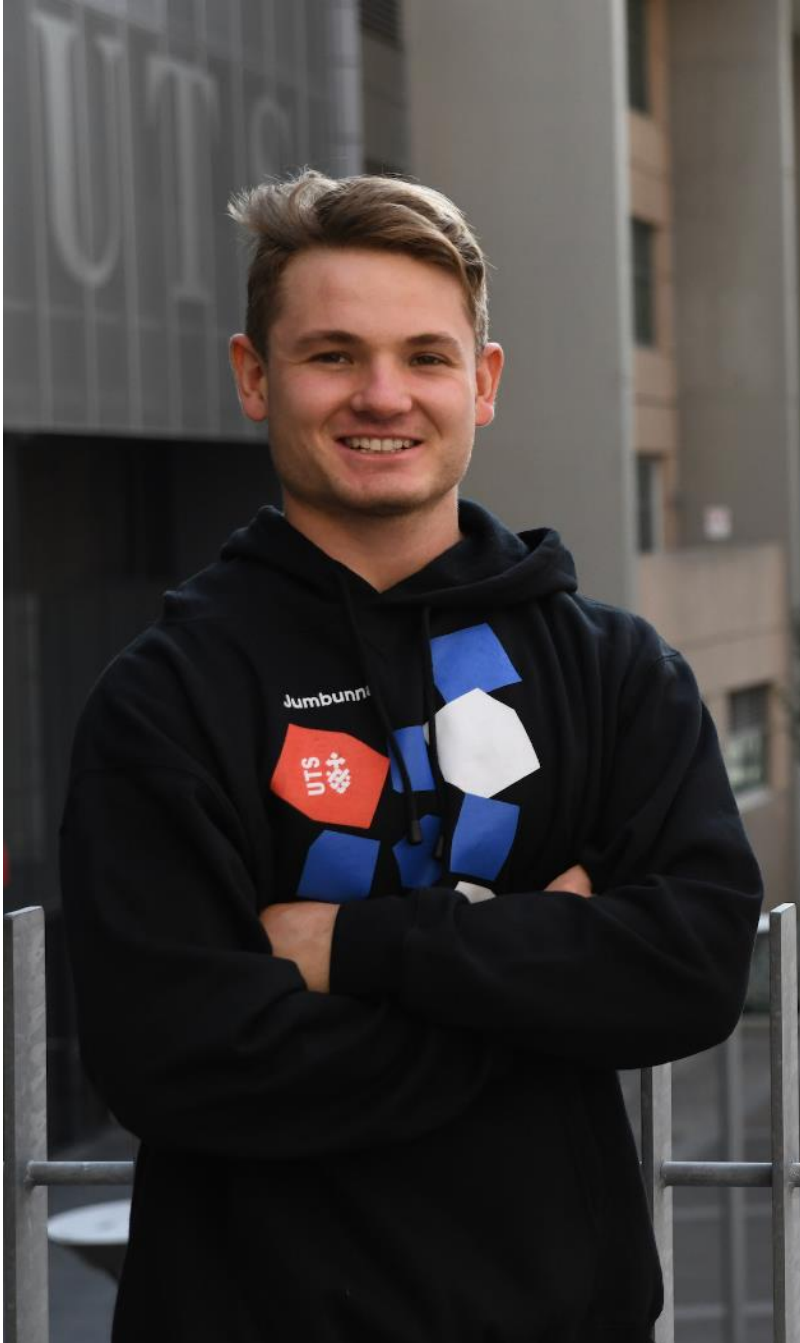

What are the entry requirements?

Cadets are considered on the basis of their current study results and the potential to benefit from this opportunity.

In order to be considered for this opportunity you need to complete an Expression of Interest found at the address below. This will ask you for various items of information including:

- Details of your Undergraduate degree
- Your Resume that includes education attained; awards; research publications (if applicable); professional/industry experience; and grants applied for (if applicable).
- Information about your future employment aspirations

Current honours students who apply for the Cadetship are also required to provide:

- Research Area (100 word overview)
