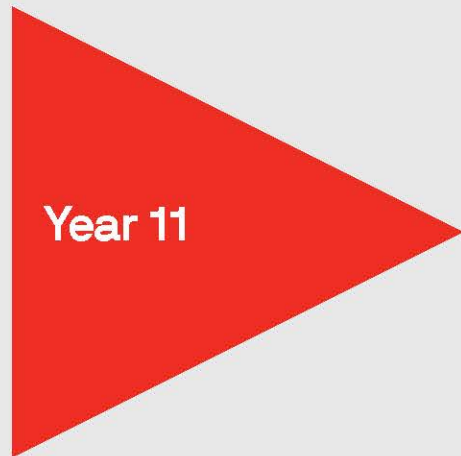


Your U@Uni Academy journey

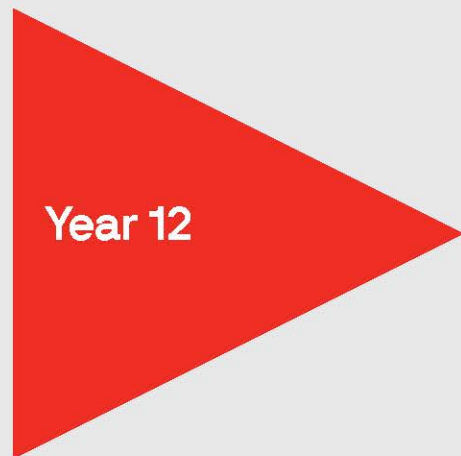
