

Graduate Certificate in Diabetes Education and Management

What will I study?

The course approaches diabetes education and management from scientific, aetiology and pathophysiological perspectives as well as exploring theories of health behaviour and the implications these have for practice. Students examine the systems in place to prevent and manage diabetes with an emphasis on the self-management model of care.

Applying to UTS

Admission requirements

Qualifications:

Bachelor's degree (or equivalent or higher qualification), or evidence of general and professional qualifications that demonstrates potential to pursue graduate studies. Previous qualifications must be in a health-related field such as nursing, allied health, or medicine.

Registration:

Current registration in Australia for one of the following: Nurse (RN or Division 1), Midwife, Accredited Practising Dietitian, Medical Practitioner, Pharmacist, Dietitian, Podiatrist, Accredited Exercise Physiologist, Physiotherapist, Psychologist, Aboriginal Health Practitioner, Optometrist.

Experience:

It is assumed that applicants have a basic knowledge of the practice of diabetes education and management. A minimum of one year exposure or experience in diabetes education is highly desirable.
